Topic

The topic of the article should be connected to ECCL’s mission, i.e. to the provision of community-based services for people with disabilities and the process of de-institutionalisation.

Word count

Articles should be around 500 to 1,500 words in length. However, this should be considered as guidance only, which means that longer or shorter articles can also be submitted.

Spelling

Contributors should use the U.K. spelling. If possible, articles should be spell checked before they are submitted.

Formatting

Articles should be sent in electronic format to the ECCL Coordinator at coordinator@community-living.info. The suggested formatting for the articles is single spaced, font Ariel, font size 12.

Photos

If possible, 1 – 2 photographs should be submitted together with the article. This can be a photograph of the author or photographs to illustrate the contents of the article.

Submission deadlines

ECCL Newsletter is published in electronic format 3 times per year (this may change to more issues in the future). Details of the next issue date can be found on ECCL’s website www.community-living.info under Resources – Newsletter.

Articles should be submitted at least one month before the publication to allow enough time for editing.

Editing process

ECCL Newsletters are edited by members of ECCL’s Management Committee Camilla Parker and John Evans. Contributors are informed of any proposed changes to the articles they have submitted. The ECCL Coordinator is responsible for the final editing and design of the newsletter. If necessary, editors may decide to publish an article in a later issue, depending on the number of articles received and the theme of each issue of the Newsletter.
